Drawing Near To God

Worldliness Separates James 4:1-4

- Worldliness "interest in, concern with, or <u>devotion to things of</u> <u>this world</u> especially as opposed to a future stage of existence (as after death)." (Webster) cf. Titus 2:11
- Source of "wars and fights." cf. Matthew 15:18ff
 - Lusts, pleasures. cf. Luke 8:14
- Verse 2, so strong, you "kill and covet."
 - cf. 1 John 3:15; Matthew 5:21-22
- Ask not. cf. Matthew 7:7-9; 21:22, "And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive."
- Ask amiss ... motive wrong. Selfish gratification.

Drawing Near To God

"<u>Ye Adulteresses</u>" James 4:4-6

- Love for God compromised.
 - In Old Testament God's people pictured as His wife. Isaiah 54:5; Jeremiah 3:14; cf. Hosea 2:2-5; 3:1-5; 9:1
 - In New Testament Church is the Bride of Christ. Ephesians 5:22-23; Romans 7:1-4
 - Espoused to one husband. 2 Corinthians 11:2-3
 - Singleness of affection. cf. Ephesians 6:5; Colossians 3:22
 - Friendship with the world, makes one an enemy of God. James 4:4; Colossians 3:1-3;
 - cf. Matthew 6:19, 33; 19:16-22

Drawing Near To God

"Priorities" ...

- The word **priority** came into the English language in the 1400s. It was singular. It meant the very first or prior thing. It stayed singular for the next five hundred years.
- Only in the 1900s did we pluralize the term and start talking about priorities. Illogically, we reasoned that by changing the word we could bend reality. Somehow we would now be able to have multiple "first" things.
- People and companies routinely try to do just that. One leader told me of this experience in a company that talked of "Pri-1, Pri-2, Pri-3, Pri-4, and Pri-5."This gave the impression of many things being the priority, but actually meant nothing was. (Greg McKeown, <u>Essentialism</u>)

Drawing Near To God

"<u>Ye Adulteresses</u>" James 4:4-6

James 4:5, "Or think ye that the scripture speaketh in vain?"

No specific Old Testament text referenced.

- Is the "spirit" the Holy Spirit or the human spirit?
- Is the spirit to be taken as the subject of the verb "*yearns*" or as its object?
- Is "envy" to be seen as "unrighteous desire" or as "righteous jealousy"?

Drawing Near To God

"<u>Ye Adulteresses</u>" James 4:4-6

- James 4:5, "Doth the <u>spirit</u> which he made to dwell in us long unto <u>envying</u>?"ASV
- James 4:5, "He jealously desires the <u>Spirit</u> which He has made to dwell in us" NASU
- James 4:5, "He yearns <u>jealously</u> over the <u>spirit</u> that he has made to dwell in us" ESV

Drawing Near To God

"<u>Ye Adulteresses</u>" James 4:4-6

Note: God created the human spirit for fellowship with Him and yearns for the loyalty and devotion of that spirit which He placed within us. cf. Genesis 1:28

Jeremiah 3:14, "Return, O backsliding children, saith Jehovah; for I am a husband unto you: and I will take you one of a city, and two of a family, and I will bring you to Zion" (cf. Hosea 2:19ff)

Acts 17:27, "... that they should seek God, if haply they might feel after him and find him, though he is not far from each one of us."

Drawing Near To God

"Submit therefore unto God" James 4:6-10

- cf. Proverbs 3:34, "Surely he scoffeth at the scoffers; But he giveth grace unto the lowly."
- Only by submitting to God can His blessings be received.
- God *"gives*" grace to the humble.
 - World promises and doesn't deliver.
 - God "gives" (present tense) and delivers.
 - Initial forgiveness. Ephesians 2:5; Romans. 5:1ff, 20
 We live by His grace. Hebrews 4:16, *"grace and peace*" to you all ...
- "More." "In a greater degree" (The Complete Word Study Dictionary)

Drawing Near To God

"Submit therefore unto God." James 4:6-10 God "gives" GRACE, "To The Humble."

• DRAWING NEAR TO GOD CALLS FOR DECISIVE ACTION !

- "<u>Be</u> Subject" to God Yield to His will. cf. Matthew 16:24, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me."
- "<u>Resist</u> the Devil"- Do not yield. cf. 1 Peter 5:8-9
- "<u>Draw near</u> to God" Full assurance of faith.
- Hebrews 10:22

Drawing Near To God

"Submit therefore unto God." James 4:6-10

- ... DECISIVE ACTION:
 - "<u>Cleanse</u> your hands" by repentance. cf. Luke 13:3; 1 John 1:9
 - "<u>Purify</u> your hearts" obey the truth. cf. 1 Peter 1:22
 - "<u>Be afflicted</u>, mourn, weep" Godly sorrow for your sins. Psalms 34:18, "Jehovah is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart, and saveth such as are of a contrite spirit." cf. Psalms 51; cf. 2 Corinthians 7:10-11
- "<u>Humble</u> yourselves in the sight of the Lord."-
- o cf. 1 Peter 5:5-6

Drawing Near To God

"<u>HE shall exalt you</u>." James 4:6-10

- Matthew 23:5-12; cf. Matthew 6 Those who wanted to be exalted <u>among the people</u>.
- 1 Peter 5:5-6, "... Yea, all of you gird yourselves with humility, to serve one another: for God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace to the humble. Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that **HE** may exalt you in due time."

Drawing Near To God

- Azariah told Asa, king of Judah, "Jehovah is with you, while ye are with him; and if ye seek him, he will be found of you; but if ye forsake him, he will forsake you." (2 Chronicles 15:2)
- "Seek ye Jehovah while he may be found; call ye upon him while he is near: let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; and let him return unto Jehovah, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon." (Isaiah 55:6-7)
