How should I respond to the grace of God?

- Last night, we addressed the grace of God.
 We noted it is God's favor, His part in our salvation
- Grace is also the PRIME factor in our salvation.
- But it does NOT remove our need to respond.
- It can be abused in many ways

How Should I Respond to The Grace of God?

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I need to deal with my sins

- As noted, God has done His part
- Ephesians 2:8-9; Titus 2:11; etc.
- In scripture, men heard the truth and were convicted - Acts 2:37-38; 16:29-30; 9:6; etc.
- I need to obey the gospel -Acts 2:38
- As a Christian, I need to take care of my sins Acts 8:22; 1 John 1:7-9

I need to deal with my sins

What about sins that I struggle with?

 Most, even as Christians, have weaknesses and spiritual struggles - we are prone to sin (NOTE: We do NOT have to sin) - Galatians 5:16-17
 Satan exploits these -

2 Corinthians 2:11; 1 Peter 5:8

- It is these struggles that we often wrestle with in our minds and cause us to doubt our salvation
- How do we deal with these?

I need to deal with my sins

What about sins that I struggle with?

- First, understand that we cannot persist in sin and be pleasing to God
 1 John 3:6-9; Romans 6:1-2
- But, if we are truly striving to do right and working to overcome our sins and weaknesses, we ought to be living with assurance -1 John 1:7-9; 2:1-2; etc.

I need to deal with my sins

I must do what I can to overcome

- We cannot persist in sins and be rebellious and expect God to be pleased with us OR to ignore what we are doing. We HAVE TO keep trying!
- We must NEVER give up!
- Romans 12:21; 1 John 5:4-5 Luke 13:24 - strive! Consider Galatians 5:24, we must crucify the flesh with its passions

I need to deal with my sins

- BUT, in these matters know that God's grace IS greater than our sins
- Romans 5:20-21, (but do NOT forget 6:1-2).

- He has forgiven and wants to forgive us - **2 Peter 3:9**, applies to struggling Christians as well

I need to deal with my sins

- God's grace IS greater than our sins
- Know that when He forgives, He forgets Acts 3:19 (blotted out erased),
 Jeremiah 31:34;
 cf. Psalms 103:11-12
- BUT, we have to be doing our part! We CANNOT dismiss our need for repentance!

I need to deal with my sins

- Can we reach a point where we cannot be forgiven?
- It is possible 1 John 5:16; Hebrews 6:4-6.
 Such is descriptive of one who has CHOSEN to harden his heart, seared his conscience 1 Timothy 4:2
 - He is in a state RIGHT NOW where forgiveness is impossible
 - Even then, I believe one can return, but it is up to him to do so! (e.g. Manasseh)
 - There is NO guarantee that such will happen

I need to resolve to live for Him

- Because of God's grace I am a new creation
- 2 Corinthians 5:17; Romans 6:3-4; Ephesians 4:17
 - I put on the new man
 - I live soberly, righteously, and zealously **Titus 2:11-14**
 - I obey Him Hebrews 5:9;
 - cf. 1 John 1:5-10 walking in the light

I need to resolve to live for Him

- Because of God's grace I am a new creation
- If I truly appreciate God's grace, it is going to change me! It will be reflected in the way I talk, walk and even think. It will be evident.

I need to be thankful

- Thanksgiving is the appropriate response to God's grace
- 2 Corinthians 9:15 thanks be to God for His indescribable gift.
 9 times (NKJV) the word for grace is translated "thanks" - 2 Timothy 1:3;
 1 Corinthians 15:57
- We always give thanks 1 Thessalonians 5:18; Ephesians 5:20
- Can I EVER thank God enough?

I need to humble myself

- Truly appreciating God's grace puts me where I belong in relation to him
- Matthew 5:3 poor in spirit James 4:6, 10 - He gives grace to the humble, He lifts us up Luke 17:7-10 - speaks of a servant doing his work and still realizing he is unprofitable - gratitude leads to humility!

I need to trust Him

- Appreciating God's grace means that I know He can do what needs to be done! This is what FAITH is about!
- Hebrews 11:6
 Ephesians 1:12-13 in Him you also trusted

 Hebrews 13:9 let your heart be established by grace confidence

I need to show Him reverence

- Knowing what His grace has done, He is worthy of my utmost respect!
- Hebrews 12:28 we serve Him with reverence and godly fear
 reflected in the way I worship Him cf. Colossians 3:16; John 4:24
 - cr. Colossians 3:16; John 4:2

I need to use my abilities

- God's grace is available to everyone, but we are all different.
- Romans 12:6 our gifts are given to us by His grace. Will we use what we have and be content with that?

- God has ALWAYS demanded that we give Him our best - cf. Matthew 6:33; 22:37; Romans 12:1; Colossians 3:23; etc.

- If we truly appreciate God, we will not give Him "leftovers"

I need to show grace to others

- God's grace appreciated will NOT be kept to ourselves
- Matthew 28:19-20 we need to be striving to reach others
 Romans 1:7 - Paul's greetings to others included grace (more than a word)
 - I need to serve others -

1 Peter 4:9-11 - good stewards of God's manifold grace

I need to show grace to others

- God's grace appreciated will NOT be kept to ourselves
- Why would I want to keep it to myself? cf. 1 Corinthians 9:16; 2 Corinthians 5:10-11 Luke 24:32 - did not our hearts burn within us?

I need to keep studying His word

- In His word, we learn of His grace how to live with it, etc.
- Grace is associated with His word -Acts 20:32
 2 Peter 3:18 - grow in the grace and knowledge of Him

I need to accept who I am

- 1 Corinthians 15:9-10 Paul acknowledged this
 This includes my past, where I am right
 - now, my abilities and limitations. - I cannot let my past keep me from
 - noving forward Philippians 3:13-14
 I need to make the best of who I am acknowledging that this is how God made me
 - Remember that God does NOT expect more of me than I am or can handle

I need to know I can fall from grace

Galatians 5:4; Hebrews 12:15

While God's grace is great and can keep us, we must never forget that we can CHOOSE to walk away!
As long as we live, we have not yet reached the goal
1 Corinthians 9:27

Consider again 1 Corinthians 15:10, But by the grace of God I am what I am, and <u>His grace toward me was not</u> <u>in vain</u>; but I labored more abundantly than they all, yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me. The grace of God
