I Have The Right To Be Happy Ecclesiastes 7:1-6

Have The Right To Be Happy! We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their creator with certain unalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." (Thomas Jefferson, Declaration of Independence, July 4, 1776) The phrase gives three examples of the "unalienable rights" which the Declaration says have been given to all human beings by their Creator, and which governments are created to protect.

I Have The Right To Be Happy!

- The use/abuse of intoxicants (alcohol, drugs, trying to cope)!
- <u>Materialism</u> bigger is better, more is best! (cf. Don Snider, not happier with more!)
- Entertainment (Camping out to buy tickets to see _____. Church programs)!



Ecclesiastes 2:1-10

Ecclesiastes 2:10 "And whatsoever mine eyes desired I kept not from them; <u>I</u> withheld not my heart from any joy; for my heart rejoiced because of all my labor; and this was my portion from all my labor."

Ecclesiastes 12:13

"(This is) the end of the matter; all hath been heard: fear God, and keep his commandments; for this is the whole (duty) of man."

Ecclesiastes 7:1-6

" A (good) name is better than precious oil; and the day of death, than the day of one's birth. It is better to go to the <u>house of mourning</u> than to go to the house of feasting: for that is the end of all men; and the living will lay it to his heart. <u>Sorrow is better than laughter</u>; for by the <u>sadness</u> of the countenance the heart is made glad. The <u>heart of the wise is in the house of</u> <u>mourning</u>; but the heart of fools is in the house of <u>mirth</u>. It is better to hear the rebuke of the wise, than for a man to hear the song of fools. For as the crackling of thorns under a pot, so is the laughter of the fool: this also is vanity."
