Preaching Like Paul

1 Corinthians 11:1; Philippians 4:9

Paul's Effectiveness Lay In Many Things

- He was *"not ashamed of the gospel of Christ,"* and he had strong faith in its *"power"* to save. (Romans 1:16)
- He believed in the headship and the Lordship of Jesus Christ. (Ephesians 1:22-23; Romans 10:9)
- He was willing to *"endure hardship as a good soldier of Jesus Christ."* (2 Timothy 2:3, 10)
- He strongly believed in prayer and was not embarrassed to ask his brethren to pray *"for me."* (Ephesians 6:19)

Paul's Effectiveness Lay In Many Things

- He worked with others, and trained them to succeed him (cf. his letters to Timothy and Titus).
- He was *"set for the defense of the gospel."* (Philippians 1:17)
- He was determined to magnify Christ in his body, "whether by life or by death." (Philippians 1:20)
- He never lost sight of that "crown of righteousness." (2 Timothy 4:8)

Preaching Like Paul

➢Paul was bold in his speech.

- At Paphos on the island of Cypress. (Acts 13:7-10)
- Paul endeavored to reason with the people.
 - In the synagogue in Antioch of Pisidia. (Acts 13:14-40)
- > Paul rightly "divided the word of truth."
 - Contrasted the law and the gospel (Galatians 2:16; 3:16-29; 4:21-31; Colossians 2:14-17; etc.).
 - Told of the consequences of returning to the law. *"you have fallen from grace"* (Galatians 5:4)

Preaching Like Paul

➢ Paul preached what was needed.

- To unbelieving Jews who rejected Christ, beginning with their law, Paul preached the truth about the person of Christ. (Acts 13)
- In Athens, Paul preached the truth about the one true God. (Acts 17:16-33)
- To Felix and Drusilla, Paul "reasoned about righteousness, self-control, and the judgment to come." (Acts 24:25)

Preaching Like Paul

Paul declared "the whole counsel of God." (Acts 20:27)

➢Paul was not adverse to calling names.

- Hymenaeus and Alexander whom he *"delivered unto Satan that they may learn not to blaspheme."* (1 Timothy 1:20)
- Hymenaeus and Philetus who had *"strayed concerning the truth."* (2 Timothy 2:17-18)
- "Demas has forsaken me" and that "Alexander the coppersmith did me much harm." (2 Timothy 4:10, 14)
- Peter was guilty of hypocrisy. (Galatians 2:11-13)

Preaching Like Paul

Paul was passionate when he encountered those who were perverting the gospel. (Acts 15:2; Galatians 2:5)

> Paul was concerned about the purity of the church.

• He charged the brethren in Corinth to "deliver such a one unto Satan," declaring "that a little leaven leavens the whole lump." (1 Corinthians 5:5-6)

➢Paul was humble.

- "Chief" of sinners (1 Timothy 1:15).
- "Less than the least of all saints" (Ephesians 3:8).
- Preached "Christ and him crucified" (1 Corinthians 2:2); he did not elevate himself.

Preaching Like Paul

➢ Paul preached when he was supported (Philippians 4:15-16) and when he was not.

- Labored *"night and day,"* not being a burden to any, in his effort to preach *"the gospel of God"* (1 Thessalonians 2:9).
- He taught that brethren ought to support men who preach (1 Corinthians 9; 11:8-9), but this was not a factor in determining whether or not he would preach!

Paul was no quitter. (Philippians 3:13-14)

- He endured when he was in trouble. (2 Corinthians 11:23ff)
- It is probable that very few churches of Christ today would tolerate a preacher like Paul!

Preaching Like Paul

➢ Paul was tactful. "Grace to you and peace from God your Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." (10 times) NOTE: Philemon

Paul was happy. (Philippians 4:6, 11; 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 18)

Preaching Like Paul

"He preach'd as though he ne'er would preach again, as a dying man to dying men."
