believer will have a bodily resurrection.



Bodily Resurrection when Jesus Returns: 1 Corinthians 15 "Thus, out of the decay of Judaism arose the spiritual body of Christianity that became fully developed or resurrected by the end-time.

spiritual body of Christianity that became fully developed or resurrected by the end-time. Hence, this is the primary meaning of Paul's statement 'It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body and there is a spiritual body." (The Spirit of Prophecy, King, pages 199-200)

Refuting the AD 70 abuse of 1 Corinthians 15

- "No bodily resurrection of the dead" error to be rejected due to Christ's bodily resurrection, 15:13-20
- Bodily <u>resurrection of Christ</u> ("first fruits") was the beginning of the resurrection that will be completed when He <u>bodily</u> and <u>visibly</u> returns, 15:21-26

Refuting the AD 70 abuse of 1 Corinthians 15


- If there is no bodily resurrection then conversion, devoted sacrifice, and separation from the world is futile!
 15:29-34 (cf. Philippians 3:20-21; Colossians 3:4)
- The body of every dead person will be raised from the dead, 15:35-49

Refuting the AD 70 abuse of 1 Corinthians 15

- Our future bodily resurrection is VICTORY "through our Lord Jesus Christ." 15:57
- Our faithful and steadfast labor is not in vain, 15:58
- AD 70 doctrine renders future hope in resurrection false and futile!
